Dear Blue Heron Pines Residents:

Your board of directors have had a very busy month and wanted to update all of our homeowners on the various projects being prioritized and/or recently completed.

1. The 2025 budget was approved at the October 23 board meeting and a modest increase of \$4 per month will be assessed starting in January. The Board, initiated by our Treasurer, Phil Gilbert, is investigating some very creative ways to keep our maintenance fees from increasing for 2026. Updates will be provided soon.

2. The Board is prioritizing the repair and or replacement of sidewalk slabs throughout the community that are identified as tripping hazards. Sidewalks in front of homes are the responsibility of homeowners. However the Board has a reimbursement process that will be detailed to homeowners whose sidewalks are identified as dangerous.

3. The Board and DiLucia in coordination with the Galloway Township Public Works department had a "No Outlet" sign installed at Bally Bunion Drive and Country Club Drive to hopefully reduce traffic and speed at that end of our community street.

4. The Board and DiLucia have also been pursuing the possibility of a 4 way stop sign at the corner of Saint Andrews and Country Club Drive to reduce speeding along Country Club. The Galloway Township Police Department is doing a study to see if a 4 way stop sign is warranted. Updates again to follow.

5. The Board is now hiring contractors to see the condition of the Blue Heron entrance signs on Leipzig as well as Tilton road. These signs have a life expectancy of approximately 20 years. The Board is hoping that caulking, possible minor structural repairs as well as power washing and painting will keep these signs looking aesthetically pleasing for a number of years.

Updates will follow after contractors determine the condition and work needed for our entrance signs.

Also, a reminder to all our homeowners that there are two open seats for our board of directors and nomination forms are available at our website, the clubhouse or at the DiLucia Management office. The deadline for filing nomination forms is November 15.

Finally, our recreation committee is planning both a tree trimming as well as a holiday party. These two activities are great ways for all of us to strengthen community relationships as well as get into the holiday spirit.
