The following items are NOT ACCEPTED during this drop-off event:

NO Commercial/Business Materials. This event is for residential waste only.

NO Tires. Tires can be taken to the ACUA, 6700 Delilah Road in EHT. (Fee applies).

NO Construction/Demolition Debris. Recyclable debris (brick, concrete, clean wood), can be taken to any Class B Recycling facility. (Fee applies).

Non-Recyclable debris, (painted, stained or treated wood, drywall) can be taken to the ACUA. (Fee applies).

NO Electronics. Electronic Devices such as TVs, Computers & Components, Stereo Equipment, DVDs, VCRs and Microwaves can be brought to our Galloway Road Convenience Center on the 1" Saturday of each month from 8 AM – 2PM.

NO Hazardous Waste. Howsehold Hazardous Waste can be taken to the ACUA. Contact ACUA at 609-272-6950 for specific date and times.

NO Large Freon-Containing Items. Large items containing Freon (refrigerators and freezers) can be taken to the ACUA. (Fee applies).
